AB 783 (Ting) Single-User Restrooms

Start Date: January 1, 2024 Legislation: <u>AB 783 (www.leginfo.legislature.ca.gov)</u>

SUMMARY

All local governments that issue new or renew business licenses, equivalent instruments, or permits must provide written notice that single-user toilet facilities must be identified as all-gender toilet facilities.

AB 783 is related to AB 1732 (Ting) from 2016, which enacted a restroom policy requiring all single-occupancy restrooms in businesses, government buildings, and places of public accommodation be available to everyone. AB 1732 authorized health inspection officials to check for compliance during health inspections.

AB 783 is designed to boost compliance with AB 1732 by ensuring businesses are aware of the requirements.

IMPLEMENTING AB 783

HdL has launched a new website to centralize the AB 783 and other state-mandated notices. The new website is statebusinessnotices.hdlgov.com. It is available now. The website is open to all local governments and businesses regardless of their affiliation with HdL.

In addition to this publicly available website, HdL is updating its communication channels to educate businesses about the notices.

- Outgoing Emails to Businesses Near the signature block, HdL will add an advisory stating The State has mandated certain notices that may affect your business. You may review the notices at: statebusinessnotices.hdlgov.com.
- Telephone System HdL will add a recorded message notifying the caller of the URL.
- Landing Page Websites HdL will add a notice of and link to the URL.
